BOWEN ORGANISES 3-DAY TRAINING FOR REGISTRY STAFF

The workshop which held at the Timothy Olagbe-

miro Library from 10th to 12th December, 2018 was facilitated by Prince Tony Dogun II, the Registrar of Ritman University, Ikot-Ekpen, Akwa-Ibom State.

In his opening address, the Vice-Chancellor, represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Prof. John Akande said the major focus of the University is to incul-

cate high performance at all levels in the university, and the registry staff is expected to play a crucial role as custodians of the University's records.
