
## NIGERIAN BAPTIST CONVENTION PASSES VOTE OF CONFIDENCE ON PROF. OGUNWOLE

An electrical and computer engineer, Augustine Ogar has urged Nigerians, especially youths to be solutions providers and not job seekers as a way of being self reliant and employers of labor. The engineer who recently had a seminar about electricity generation

in Bowen University is an inventor of a hydro-electric power generator. He said coming up with such an idea was not an easy task. According to him, the challenge of electricity in Nigeria motivated him to invent the generator as a solution. The generator can be used to convert the velocity of water into electricity, and can be used during the dry season to get water to curb water

shortages which people normally experience at that time.

He implored youths to focus on impacting lives rather than being money conscious and called on the government to offer support for the youths of this country, especially the aspiring inventors.

Speaking at the forum, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Joshua Ogunwole said the purpose of the meeting was to communicate to

parents the progress the university has made so far in the few months of the new administration and the plans the University has to ensure the institution is a force to reckon with in terms of entrepreneurship and academic excellence.
